“IF YOU HAVE BEEN RAISED WITH CHRIST, SEEK THE THINGS THAT ARE ABOVE”

On May 9, in the Basilica of Saint Ambrose in Milan, Archbishop Mario Delpini officially initiated the testimonial phase of the beatification process for Fr. Luigi Giussani, the founder of the Communion and Liberation movement. This day coincided with the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, which Milan observes on its traditional date, 40 days after Easter, in keeping with an ancient custom.

The selection of this date was significant as Giussani frequently emphasized the importance of the Ascension in the Christian faith. He described the Ascension as “the feast of liberation, of daily transfiguration.” He elaborated, “The thrust of our daily life is the mystery of Christ, who takes possession of all things, knocks on our door, shakes our bed to awaken us, and instills in us a different energy and a new sensitivity in our hearts: recognizing this is the transfiguration of our life.”

One might question how Christ—in the moment of leaving his disciples and ascending into heaven—can be said to “take possession of everything.” For Giussani, reality is a sign of something greater—whether a sunset, the beauty of mountains, or the love between two people. Every passion that compels us to grasp and possess something beautiful is merely a sign of a greater beauty, a greater love that lies hidden beyond. It is the presence of Christ at the root of everything.

The Ascension marks the moment when the disciples must accept, once and for all, that the beauty and love of Christ reside in his belonging to heaven, to the Father. He had to leave to prevent them from the grave error of believing he was everything to them. Jesus is, indeed, everything for us, but only because he continually points beyond himself, to the Father, and the Holy Spirit.

With the Ascension, the disciples were compelled to look upwards, acknowledging the truth about Jesus: He was truly God, and his rightful place was not just on earth but above and deeply intertwined with everything.

Interestingly, after his departure, the relationship between Jesus and the apostles grew stronger. Giussani observed, “What unites us to God in his absence is prayer, as the pinnacle of self-forgetfulness which involves asking in the name of Christ, for his kingdom to come. Our prayer should be a plea for the Spirit to bring to fruition what he has begun in us, because he knocks at our door, if we let him in.” Maturing in faith means recognizing that Jesus is now completely free to reach out to us at any moment; he knocks on the door of our heart, urging us toward unexpected adventures. As children, we might trail behind our parents, often reluctant. As adults, it is the presence within us, the Holy Spirit, that propels us forward. Prayer thus becomes the ordinary way to speak to him, to listen to him, to cultivate a personal relationship with him.

For this reason, Giussani calls the Ascension “the feast of liberation, of daily transfiguration.” It’s a liberation because it opens us to all the possibilities that the Spirit may offer. We are no longer bound by one place, one family, or one language; wherever we go, there Jesus is, waiting for us, providing us with sustenance and companionship—as ultimately illustrated in the Acts of the Apostles, which begin with the Ascension. It is also a transfiguration because it teaches us to seek Jesus beyond the mundane appearance of things. As Saint Paul says, “If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above” (Col 3:1). Everything is a sign, pointing upward toward the place where Christ has ascended and from where he continuously returns until the end of time. ■

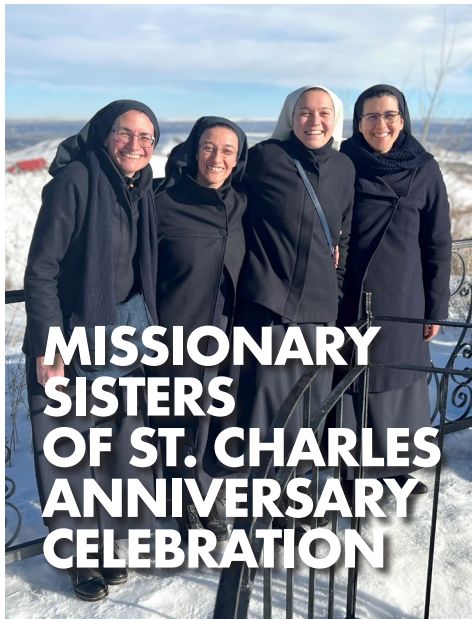

**EVANGELIUM VITAE MEDAL
AWARDED TO
DR. ELVIRA PARRAVICINI**

The Evangelium Vitae Medal is a national award for heroes of the pro-life movement.

The deNicola Center for Ethics and Culture, a center at the University of Notre Dame which promotes “sharing the richness of the Catholic intellectual tradition through teaching, research, and public engagement,” presented Elvira Parravicini with its Evangelium Vitae Medal on April 27. The Evangelium Vitae Medal recognizes exceptional work in the area of pro-life initiatives, and has been awarded to religious sisters, political activists, professors, and medical doctors who have worked tirelessly to care for unborn babies and their mothers.

Dr. Parravicini’s work as the founder of the Neonatal Comfort Care Program and professor of pediatrics at the Columbia University Medical Center has made a significant contribution to



the conversation and care for the life and dignity of the human person at every stage. Her work focuses on the needs of families whose babies have received high-risk or life-threatening diseases before birth. O. Carter Snead, the director of the deNicola Center, commented, “In her life’s work providing state-of-the-art medical attention, holistic comfort care, and emotional, psychological, and spiritual support to families who receive life-limiting diagnoses, Dr. Parravicini has fought consistently, courageously, and with love to heal our vision of these children

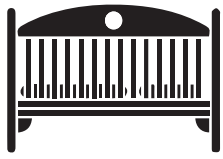

FROM ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

On Mother's Day, we honor and remember our mothers, grandmothers, aunts, sisters and also those friends who have acted like moms to us.

At the St. Vincent de Paul Society, we have many moms and grandmothers who are members of the society. They reach out to those in need who are often moms themselves. The 20th century saint, Gianna Beretta Molla (1922–1962), was also a mother and a member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Born in Italy to a large family, she became a pediatrician. Gianna focused on helping “mothers, babies, the elderly, and the poor.”

The son of St. Gianna, Pierluigi Molla, who was five years old when his mom died, said that his mom was “extremely normal.” She loved to ski and climb or hike. (See Salt + Light Media Interview on Connect5 January 27, 2016). When Gianna was pregnant with her last child, the doctors found a fibroma. She opted to remove as much of the tumor as possible, but not remove her uterus, so the baby would have the best chance to live. Her daughter Gianna Emanuela Molla was born but her mom died of an infection seven days after her daughter's birth. Gianna Emanuela went on to become a geriatrician and helped to take care of her dad Pietro the last seven years of his life. Pietro was present with his three adult children at his wife's canonization by Pope John Paul II on May 16, 2004. Gianna Emanuela Molla now devotes time to remember her mom and dad's legacy.

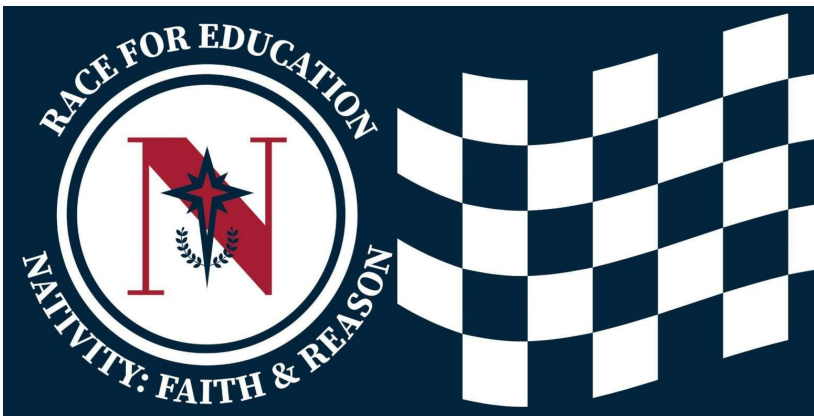

Nativity is under the pastoral care of the **Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo**, a religious order, founded in 1985 by Msgr. Massimo Camisasca in Italy. The order has its origins in the charism of Fr. Luigi Giussani, founder of the Catholic lay movement Communion and Liberation (CL). Here is how the Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo is described by the founder, Msgr. Massimo Camisasca:

Fraternity: “The Fraternity is a companionship made up of people that are placed together by an Other. [...] Each of us [...] is continually accompanied by Christ through his brothers.”

Priestly: “The priestly vocation [...] is a continuous communion with God and man. [...] It acts as a bridge between heaven and earth, represents a fundamental link in the history of salvation, and also serves as an important figure in the journey towards unity among men.”

Missionary: “Mission [...] consists simply in entering within the same mission for which God sent His own Son into the world, for which the Son sent the Apostles, and for which, in turn, the Apostles sent other brothers, until the visible echo of that event touched even us.”

The priests of the Fraternity live together in houses of three or more. The communion among them is meant to sustain their vocation and be a path towards conversion. They are willing to be sent around the world wherever the Church has a need, according to the wishes of the bishop of the diocese in which they reside. Learn more at:

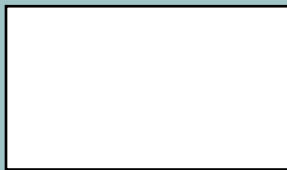
