

ver the past few years, I have recognized how important it is to have my brother priests of my community continuously remind me to look at the cross. We always begin and finish each day with communal prayer in our chapel or in front of a sacred image of Christ or the Virgin Mary. I have come to be more aware of how precious our friendship is; it is the privileged place which reminds me and educates me to look at Christ's merciful love on the cross. Often, I find myself distracted, worried, sometimes annoyed at myself and others. These special moments help me to lift my gaze from these problems and difficulties and see them through the lens of the cross. Everything seems to find its proper place when seen with and through His mercy.

I was deeply struck by the beauty of the readings and antiphons from the Mass and the Liturgy of the Hours on the Feast of the Exultation of the Holy Cross (September 14th). The Liturgy of the Hours (also known as the Divine Office or Breviary) is the daily prayer of the Church which marks the hours of the day and sanctifies them with prayer. Today, I would like to share and comment on a few of the liturgical jewels that the Church gave us to reflect upon that day. Through the wisdom of the Church which is reflected in the choice

of prayers and readings, we can better understand the centrality of the mystery of the Cross as the display of God's infinite love for us and for the whole world.

Feast of the Holy Cross. The origin of the feast dates to the fourth century when the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, St. Helena, went to the Holy Land on a pilgrimage to visit and pray at the important sites of Jesus' life. She wanted to go to the place where Jesus was crucified and find the cross upon which he hung. According to tradition, following the crucifixion of Jesus, the Jews hid the True Cross and covered it with rocks to prevent the Christians from venerating it. However, there was a small group of Christians who knew this information and passed it down over the centuries. After speaking with many locals and with the assistance of the Bishop of Jerusalem, St. Helena found the location of the crucifixion as well as the True Cross. The legend recounts that while digging, they found three crosses. To determine the True Cross, they laid them out on the ground, and St. Macarius, the Bishop of Jerusalem at the time, asked a woman with a deadly disease to touch each of the crosses. The first two had no effect on her, but upon touching the third, the woman was immediately healed.

"What a great work of charity! Death itself died when life was slain on the tree." This antiphon from Evening Prayer reminds us that the mystery of Jesus' death on the cross is, above all, an act of Divine charity. Charity can be described as a gratuitous, selfless act of love to affirm friendship between God and man. St. Paul tells us that death, the complete separation from God at the end of life, was introduced into the world through sin (Romans 6:23). God the Father sent his only Son, Jesus, into the world to reveal the truth of God's infinite love for humanity and to restore to us the familiarity with God which was lost because of sin. The antiphon refers to the "tree" which points to the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil and the eating of the forbidden fruit (Genesis 2-3). The Cross is the new and definitive "Tree of Life." Dying on the Cross, Jesus completely shattered the wall which separated humanity from God; Jesus' death changed the meaning of death forever. Through the death and resurrection of Christ, life and love have definitively triumphed over sin and death.


"The Lord hung upon the cross to wash away our sins in his own blood. How splendid is that blessed cross." This antiphon from Morning Prayer invites us to look upon the crucified Lord hanging on the cross. Often, we fall into the terrible temptation to dwell and focus our attention more on our sins and the sins of others than the mystery of Christ's love on the cross. The darkness of our personal sin and the sins of the world can only be enlightened by the mystery of God's love for us revealed on the cross. We have absolutely no ability to free ourselves from the bonds of sin. It is only through the mystery of Christ's death and the shedding of his blood that we and the whole world can be forgiven. What appears to be a tragedy, the death of the Son of God on the cross, is in fact, the triumph of the splendor of mercy and the restoration of the blessed communion which was lost because of sin.

"The cross is something wonderfully great and honorable." In the second reading from the Office of Readings,

the Church gives us a beautiful text from a homily by St. Andrew of Crete (8th century Bishop). He writes:

Therefore, the cross is something wonderfully great and beautiful. It is great because through the cross the many noble acts of Christ found their consummation -very many indeed, for both his miracles and his sufferings were fully rewarded with victory. The cross is honorable because it is both the sign of God's suffering and the trophy of his victory. It stands for his suffering because, on it, he freely suffered unto death. But it is also his trophy because it is the means by which the devil was wounded and death conquered; the barred gates of hell were smashed, and the cross became the one common salvation of the whole world.

These triumphant words remind us again of the centrality of the cross for the Christian life. We are invited to remember that Christ came into the world to embrace all human suffering and to suffer with each one of us personally. We truly have a compassionate God. The cross should remind us that there is always a path to reconciliation and new life, even in the darkest moments of life. The cross of Jesus is truly our greatest trophy.



Stat crux dum volvitur orbis (The cross stands while the world revolves). These words can be found underneath the emblem of the Carthusian Order of monks, which depicts a globe surrounded by a cross. The cross of Christ is truly the center of world history. It stands firm while all the world's history and problems revolve around it. We are invited to make the mystery of the cross the anchor of our lives. If we are anchored to Jesus, we can truly survive and overcome all the storms of life.



You may feel that you cannot give so much, but give it a try. God makes it all work. Tithe back to God in thanksgiving for all that God has done.









The Eucharist is my highway to heaven. Carlo Acutis (1991-2006)

Blessed Carlo Acutis is on the road to becoming one of the first modern or millennial saints. Born in London and raised in Milan, he was a young man who enjoyed life in typical ways. He loved playing soccer, laughing and joking with his friends, as well as playing video games like Pokemon and Super Mario. He had a special love for his own pets as well as strays. Carlo was, however, also a very special young man. He had a deep love for the Eucharist and his faith. He used his talents and knowledge of computers to create a website devoted to the verified Eucharistic miracles around the world. This website and the exhibitions it has generated still operate today.

Carlo, additionally, had a very kind heart. He was there for his friends if they were having a hard time in their families. He also admired St. Francis and had a special love for helping the disadvantaged and homeless. Carlo's mom, Antonia Salzano, said her son tried to help the homeless by bringing them something to eat as well as something hot to drink. Carlo also used his savings to buy those living on the streets sleeping bags and blankets.


Devoted to the Blessed Mother and praying the rosary, Carlo also said that after the powerful weapon of the Eucharist "the Rosary is the shortest ladder to heaven." Although Carlo lost his battle to leukemia on October 12, 2006 at the age of 15, his example of strong faith while still being an ordinary kid, continues to inspire many youth. Carlo also energizes the belief of many adults like his mom Antonia who noted that her son "regenerated" her.

he 8th-grade retreat has been a long-established tradition since before I came to Nativity.

This past week our 8th graders had the chance to experience theirs.

We went to the YMCA of the Rockies in Estes Park. We began the retreat with a short hike to Sprague Lake with an outdoor Mass. More than ever this year I had the strong impression that Christ was calling those kids one by one to a closer relationship with him.

Our theme was a sentence by St. John Bosco, "Do the ordinary things of the day in an extraordinary way." Jesus wants to enter our daily life and wants us to find him there when we have to study or play, when we are happy or sad. He wants us to choose him above all else so that our lives can become extraordinary.

The kids prepared some plays about some extraordinary saints who had a very strange past, and yet, when they let Christ in, everything changed, including their hearts and their lives: Saints like St. Christopher, who was a violent man, a cannibal, and a satanist, who became a hermit and received from Jesus the new name of Christopher, which means the one who bears Christ. Or St. Genesius, who was a comic who mocked and despised Christians. He received a

vision during one of his plays, while he pretended to be baptized right in front of Emperor Diocletian, one of the most fierce persecutors. St. Genesius gave a witness of this vision and his conversion and became a martyr because of it.



Holiness is not something for a superhero, but something for all of us, 8th graders included. All we need to do is to let Christ in and he would take care of the rest.

At the end of the retreat, during the open mike session, many kids spoke about the friendship that grew among them. The most striking comments, in my opinion, were the ones who spoke about the moments of silence we had, or the moments of prayers, like Mass, adoration, confession, etc. In those moments our students experienced the closeness of Christ to their lives.

Let us pray that what began in the past few days, may bring abundant fruits in their lives!

Our Parish is under the pastoral care of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo, a Society of Apostolic Life of pontifical right, founded in 1985 by Msgr. Massimo Camisasca in Italy. The Fraternity has its origins in the charism of Fr. Luigi Giussani, founder of the movement of Communion and Liberation (CL). In their missionary activities, the priests draw from the CL charism the method of their apostolate.

The priests of the Fraternity live together in houses of three or more. They carry out their priestly service in parishes, schools, prisons, and hospitals, according to the wishes of the bishop of the diocese in which they reside. The words that best express their life are contained within the Fraternity's very name: fraternity, priestly, missionary, as described by the founder:

FRATERNITY

"The Fraternity is a companionship made up of people that are placed together by an Other, by the action of an Other who has had mercy on their lives. It is the effective sign of God's mercy. Each of us has been gathered and is continually accompanied by Christ through his brothers. Thus, the Fraternity is the place which, through our conversion, makes the memory of Christ easier and continuous."

PRIESTLY

"The priestly vocation is one of the highest and most beautiful paths that one can travel. It is a continuous communion with God and man. Like all vocations, it can be subjected to weariness and human weakness. If it is adequately sustained and aided, it acts as a bridge between heaven and Earth, represents a fundamental link in the history of salvation, and also serves as an important figure in the journey towards unity among men."

MISSIONARY

"Mission is not something that we invent; it isn't the expression of our particular talents or passions, even if it draws from all the gifts that God has given us. It consists simply in entering within the same mission for which God sent His own Son into the world, for which the Son sent the Apostles, and for which, in turn, the Apostles sent other brothers, until the visible echo of that event touched even us."


