



THE LONG WAY HOME

Dear Parishioners,

Yukon looks with excitement, and a little bit of apprehension, at the people who are entering the church. He and his twelve companions are lined up in the gathering area, outside the doors of the church, ready to join the procession led by an altar server with the cross.

In September they began the preparation to be baptized and join the Catholic Church. The whole thing has a curious name, RCIA, which means Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (the RCIC is the one for Children). It took a while for Yukon and his companions to realize what it was about: every Sunday morning they met (or had to meet) with Fr. Matteo, Beverly, George, Chuck, Merrilyn, Marylou, Bridget, Bob, and Diane, to learn the history of Israel, the Catechism, and the Sacraments.

In December their names had been enrolled in the book of the catechumens, marking the official beginning of their journey. At the beginning of Lent, during the rite of Election, Bishop Rodriguez had welcomed them and hundreds of other candidates from all over the dioceses, giving them a new name: Elects, people chosen by the Church, after a serious examination, to complete the last stage of their preparation and to be baptized on the Easter vigil. But the journey is not over yet, and this is why Paul and his companions are now ready to go through the next three steps of their preparation: the Scrutinies.

Since the beginning of the Church, the community has claimed the privilege and responsibility to evaluate the candidates for baptism. It was something similar to joining a prestigious



Country Club: a member has to present and vouch for you; the elderly had to evaluate the candidates and the whole community had to accept them. The entire process is called Scrutinies, which means Evaluation. It is not just a



formality, but a deeply spiritual experience, a moment when the Elects, their Sponsors, and the whole Christian community state their decision to move forward toward the final celebration on Easter day.

Significantly, the Scrutinies are celebrated during the last three Sundays of Lent. This collocation gives to the Elects the awareness that the time is coming, and that they are traveling through the final stage of their journey. The purpose of the Scrutinies is "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful" in the hearts of the Elect and to "strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good." (RCIA Ritual 141)

During the three-week period of the Scrutinies, the Elects open the eyes of their souls, examine carefully how sin works in their lives, and make the deliberate choice to turn away from sin so they can step joyfully into the light of Christ at their Baptism. Right after the homily, the priest lays hands on each of the Elect individually, and he prays silently over them. Among other intentions, he prays an exorcism prayer, asking God to strengthen and protect them from temptation and deceit. The whole community joins the priest and the Elects in prayers, supporting and encouraging them. This request of conversion happens for three Sundays in a row, three moments when the Holy Spirit opens the hearts of the candidates and prepares them to develop an adequate knowledge of their sinfulness with a strong desire to be cleansed by the grace of Christ through Baptism.

Yukon, who doesn't really know much of the Church and her liturgy, is a little bit uncomfortable standing up in front of the assembly; at the same time, he has a great desire to be forgiven, to receive the grace of God, and to experience the powerful connection with the community of the faithful. This is enough for him to overcome his fears and to follow the cross, not just the one carried by the young altar server, but also the real one, the one that Christ has prepared for him and for each one of his companions, as a sign of his love for them.

During the next few weeks, please pray for our Elects. They are a powerful sign to us and to the world that Christ is alive and that he keeps calling everyone to conversion.

The Missionary Sisters of Saint Charles Borromeo hosted a beautiful dinner for all Nativity parishioners on Saturday, March 4, 2023, to celebrate their 17th anniversary. The sisters cooked for 3 weeks to prepare homemade lasagna and gnocchi for over 250 guests who showed up in Cabrini Hall, with their families, friends, and newborns!







During the evening, the sisters told us a fascinating story about their house on the outskirts of Rome in the Magliana neighborhood, where they live the "miracle of hospitality" by sharing their lives with their friends and neighbors. "Every day within the walls of our house, there is at least one proposal for our friends: workshops for knitting, cooking, nativity scene making, breakfast together after the Sunday Mass, the 'coffee in company' at which our priest talks about the Gospel and answers a variety of questions, 'families in the kitchen,' a workshop that invites children to cook together with their parents and grandparents. We want to communicate to each person that everything has to do with Christ: cooking, sewing, working, drinking coffee, cleaning up, etc." Over the past few years, the sisters welcomed young women who are in difficult situations and need a new start in life. The women live with the sisters and participate in their life as in a family. The sisters offer them home stability, ordered life, real relationships, and the path to greater maturity when facing life in the world. "Our house is attached to the church of Our Lady of Pompeii, which is entrusted to our care. It is a place of daily moments of communal prayer which we propose to our residents and guests."






POPE BENEDICT XVI, ANGELUS, THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT, 2011

"Whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him, will never thirst; the water that I shall give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (Jn 4:14)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This third Sunday of Lent is characterized by the Jesus' famous conversation with the Samaritan woman, recounted by the Evangelist John. The woman went every day to draw water from an ancient well that dated back to the Patriarch Jacob and on that day she found Jesus sitting beside the well, "wearied from his journey" (Jn 4:6). St Augustine comments: "Not for nothing was Jesus tried.... The strength of Christ created you, the weakness of Christ recreated you.... With his strength he created us, with his weakness he came to seek us out" (In Ioh. Ev., 15, 2).

Jesus' weariness, a sign of his true humanity, can be seen as a prelude to the Passion with which he brought to fulfilment the work of our redemption. In the encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well, the topic of Christ's "thirst" stands out in particular. It culminated in his cry on the Cross "I thirst" (In 19:28). This thirst, like his weariness, had a physical basis. Yet Jesus, as St Augustine says further, "thirsted for the faith of that woman" (In Ioh. Ev. 15,11), as he thirsted for the faith of us all.

God the Father sent him to quench our thirst for eternal life, giving us his love, but to give us this gift Jesus asks for our faith. The omnipotence of Love always respects human freedom; it knocks at the door of man's heart and waits patiently for his answer.

In the encounter with the Samaritan woman the symbol of water stands out in the foreground, alluding clearly to the sacrament of Baptism, the source of new life for faith in God's Grace. This Gospel, in fact – as I recalled in my Catechesis

on Ash Wednesday – is part of the ancient journey of the catechumen's preparation for Christian Initiation, which took place at the great Easter Vigil. "Whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him", Jesus said, "will never

Whoever is reborn by water and by the Holy Spirit, that is, in Baptism, enters into a real relationship with God, a filial relationship, and can worship him "in spirit and in truth" (In 4:23, 24), as Jesus went on to reveal to the Samaritan woman. Thanks to the meeting with Jesus Christ and to the gift of the Holy Spirit, the human being's faith attains fulfilment, as a response to the fullness of God's revelation.

Each one of us can identify himself with the Samaritan woman: Jesus is waiting for us, especially in this Season of Lent, to speak to our hearts, to my heart. Let us pause a moment in silence, in our room or in a church or in a separate place. Let us listen to his voice which tells us "If you knew the gift of God...". May the Virgin Mary help us not to miss this appointment, on which our true happiness depends. [...]
