



FR. EMANUELE RECOUNTS HIGH SCHOOL LENT RETREAT ON SUNDAY, FEB 26 AT ST. WALBURGA ABBEY

Dear Parishioners,

Last Sunday, Sr. Marilù, Sr. Teresa, and I brought the high schoolers to a Lent retreat at the Benedictine Abbey of St. Walburga because we usually start important liturgical seasons with a half-day retreat. This time, we did it at the Abbey of contemplative nuns. The whole place speaks of God because it is inhabited by persons who pray, cook, farm, rest, clean, eat, and live solely for the reason of being in an intimate living relationship with God, in a life that is the anticipation of the life in Heaven. Their life is a reminder to us of the cause and goal of our active life.

We met the nuns only in two moments throughout the retreat. Once during a witness that Sr. Fidelis gave us at the monastery entrance, and then when we attended Vespers with them in the chapel. During the witness, Sr. Fidelis described a bit the life in the monastery through gorgeous pictures. The presentation, and the beauty of the pictures in her presentation, helped us grasp eternity in the concrete moments of their lives. She was able to witness to us that a life lived entirely in Christ is highly desirable and extremely true and beautiful. I'd say, it's truly real. It's cleared of all those unnecessary redundant words and noisy details that may encumber the human heart.


During her presentation, Sr. Fidelis was asked if she ever felt constrained, especially at the beginning, by the vow of "stability," a life lived for good in the same place. After a short and yet thoughtful reflection, she answered that, though she loved traveling when she was in the secular world, she loved and desired this stability so much because it helped her to know herself more and because it made her more available to do the will of God. That was the reason why she chose the name "Fidelis," which means "Faithful." I totally related to that experience. Only in fidelity is there human and Christian growth. Settling in a place where the landscape becomes familiar, where relationships become ordinary, where even the place where we kneel and enter into a relationship with God becomes somehow familiar and free of noisy and distracting "new" elements, there the truth of myself emerges. And so, I can discover the good that God

has planted in me, and I can see with clarity the evil he asks me to let Him root out from my heart. Then, all becomes a living relationship with Him in the ordinary, and my heart frees itself from self-centered worries and is more focused on doing His will today. Fr. Giussani always taught us that, first, God shapes our hearts in the ordinary. Then, a Christian finds his mentality shifting from "asking himself how the world can be useful to him" to "how he can be helpful to God for the salvation of the world today."

Dear parishioners, I ask you to pray for our high schoolers, that they may be more and more seized by the attracting beauty of Christ, and that they more and more desire to discover and do the will of God. And let's pray that they may find in us, adults of the parish, holy men and women, true Christians.





Dear Nativity Families,

The season of Lent fits well in the life of the Catholic school. On Tuesday, our assembly focused on Lent and the commitments we make. In our Lenten commitments, we do not promise to just avoid bad things like swearing, but make a positive assent to choosing the good. Sometimes this takes the form of sacrificing something we love like chocolate or snacking, but even then, we are directing our hearts to choose happiness from God, our ultimate source of happiness. During this season, the Church asks us to enter



FROM ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

Joseph of Arimathea courageously went to Pilate and requested the body of the crucified Jesus. Working with fellow disciple Nicodemus, Joseph then helped to take down the body of Jesus from the cross, wrapped the body in linen, and laid the body of Jesus in the tomb that was meant for himself. Inspired by the kind actions of Joseph of Arimathea, Catholic high school and college students helped to create ministry programs to provide Christian burial services for the poor and indigent. These programs were started in Cleveland, Ohio at St. Ignatius High School. The St. Joseph of Arimathea Society further expanded in the Louisville, Kentucky area. In the Louisville area, the coroner coordinates a rotating schedule with the schools' societies. Normally, the students have about 48 hours to put a funeral service together. There might be a few family members present at the service. Sometimes, however, in the case—for example—of a homeless man or woman, the students could be the only ones at the burial site to say goodbye. The programs will also vary depending on the talents of those leading the prayers and services, e.g., singing or music as well as having flowers. Previously, the group at St. Xavier High School in Louisville, Kentucky purchased headstones, but now they are making the headstones on their own. It is all about respect and dignity. Respect and dignity are values that are also important to the work of the Nativity St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) Society. For more information, see our Flocknote service at

POPE FRANCIS, ANGELUS, SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 26, 2023

Dear brothers and sisters, buongiorno!

The Gospel of this first Sunday of Lent presents to us Jesus in the desert, tempted by the devil (cf. *Mt* 4:1-11). "Devil" means "divider". The devil always wants to create division, and it is what he sets out to do by tempting Jesus. Let us see, then, *from whom* he wants to divide him, and *how* he tempts him.

From whom does the devil want to divide Jesus? After receiving Baptism from John in the Jordan, Jesus was called by the Father "my beloved Son" (*Mt* 3:17), and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in the form of a dove (cf. v. 16). The Gospel thus presents us the three divine Persons joined in love. Then Jesus himself will say that he came into the world to make us, too, partake in the unity between him and the Father (cf. *Jn* 17:11). The devil, instead, does the opposite: he enters the scene to divide Jesus from the Father and to distract him from his mission of unity for us. He always divides.

Let us now see *how* he tries to do it. The devil wants to take advantage of the human condition of Jesus, who is weak as he has fasted for forty days and is hungry (cf. Mt 4:2). The evil one then tries to instil in him three powerful "poisons", to paralyse his mission of unity. These poisons are attachment, mistrust, and power. First and foremost, the poison of attachment to material goods, to needs; with persuasive arguments the devil tries to convince Jesus: "You are hungry, why must you fast? Listen to your need and satisfy it, you have the right and the power: transform the stones into bread". Then the second poison, *mistrust*: "Are you sure the Father wants what is good for you? Test him, blackmail him! Throw yourself down from the highest point of the temple and make him do what you want". Finally, power: "You have no need for your Father! Why wait for his gifts? Follow the criteria of the world, take everything for yourself, and you will be powerful!". The three temptations of Jesus. And we too live among these temptations, always. It is terrible, but that is just how it is, for us too: attachment to material things, mistrust and the thirst for power are three widespread and dangerous temptations, which the devil uses to divide us from the Father and to make us no longer feel like brothers and sisters among ourselves, to lead us to solitude and desperation. He wanted to do this to Jesus, he wants to do it to us: to lead us to desperation.

But Jesus defeats the temptations. And how does he defeat them? By avoiding discussion with the devil and answering with the Word of God. This is important: you cannot argue with the devil, you cannot converse with the devil! Jesus confronts him with the Word of God. He quotes three phrases from the Scripture that speak of freedom from goods (cf. Dt 8:3), trust (cf. Dt 6:16), and service to God (cf. Dt 6:13), three phrases that are opposed to temptation. He never enters into dialogue with the devil, he does not negotiate with him, but he repels his insinuations with the beneficent Words of the Scripture. It is an invitation to us too; one cannot defeat him by negotiating with him, he is stronger than us. We defeat the devil by countering him in faith with the divine Word. In this way, Jesus teaches us to defend unity with God and among ourselves from the attacks of the divider. The divine Word that is Jesus' answer to the temptation of the devil.

And we ask ourselves: what place does the Word of God have in my life? Do I turn to it in my spiritual struggles? If I have a vice or a recurrent temptation, why do I not obtain help by seeking out a verse of the Word of God that responds to that vice? Then, when temptation comes, I recite it, I pray it, trusting in the grace of Christ. Let us try, it will help us in temptation, it will help us a great deal, so that, amid the voices that stir within us, the beneficent one of the Word of God will resound. May Mary, who welcomed the Word of God and with her humility defeated the pride of the divider, accompany us in the spiritual struggle of Lent.

AFTER THE ANGELUS

Dear brothers and sisters,

D istressing news continues to arrive from the Holy Land: many people killed, even children... How can this spiral of violence be stopped? I renew my appeal to make dialogue prevail over hatred and vengeance, and I pray to God for the Palestinians and Israelis, that they may find the path to fraternity and peace, with the help of the international community.

I am also very concerned about the situation in Burkina Faso, where terrorist attacks continue. I invite you to pray for the people of that dear country, so that the violence they have suffered does not make them lose faith in the path of democracy, justice and peace.

This morning I learned with sorrow of the shipwreck off the Calabrian coast, near Crotone. Forty dead have already been recovered, including many children. I pray for each one of them, for the missing and for the other surviving migrants. I thank those who have brought relief and those who are providing shelter. May Our Lady sustain these brothers and sisters of ours. And let us not forget the tragedy of the war in Ukraine; the war has already continued for a year. And let us not forget the suffering of the Syrian and Turkish people due to the earthquake. [...]

I welcome the Italian Organ Donors' Association, which is celebrating the fiftieth anniversary of its founding: I thank you for your commitment to social solidarity, and I urge you to continue to promote life through the donation of organs. A special greeting goes to those who have come on the occasion of World Rare Diseases Day, which will take place the day after tomorrow; I reiterate my encouragement to the Associations of the sick and their relatives; may our closeness never be lacking, especially to children, to let them feel God's love and tenderness.

And I wish you all a happy Sunday. Please, do not forget to pray for me. Enjoy your meal, and arrivederci!
