FROM A MULTI-ETHNIC FAMILY TO THE DESIRE TO GIVE HIS LIFE TO THE LORD: THE STORY OF THE VOCATION OF GIORGIO GHIGO, WHO BECAME A PRIEST ON JUNE 24, 2023

pril '93. It all starts there. Born prematurely, I am abandoned by my mother in the wards of the children's hospital in Turin. The nurse decides to call me Giorgio, so as not to let the registry office replace the X with any name. It all starts there because, as I often repeat to myself, "I could not be here, but I am here." The courageous decision to carry out a pregnancy, probably not expected or desired, makes me pray every day for the mother who gave God a chance to do great things. After a few months in the incubator, cared for by the nurses, my mom and dad came to adopt me. "You are not and will never be alone" is the word of God's gesture of mercy toward me. "Does a woman forget about her child, so as not to be moved by the son of her bowels? Even if they forget, I will never forget you" (Is 49:15). Radhika from India and Jesus Antonio from Colombia also arrived in my family. A multi-ethnic family!

I was the one who first asked my parents if I was born from their "belly." My mom who didn't expect this question so soon said to me, "No, Giorgio, you were not born from our belly, but something more. You were born from my heart and Dad's." This phrase was repeated to me many times especially when at the age of five, being more aware, they told me my story again. I remember crying so much because I wanted to be born to them. I didn't want to be a "half-hearted" son, I wanted to be all theirs. In the years of the seminary, with Don Francesco and Don Paolo, I learned to look at my story, to go deeper and deeper. Because there was already everything in the beginning. Now thus says the Lord who created you, who shaped you: "Do not be afraid, for I have redeemed you, I have called you by name: you belong to me. [...] Because you are precious in my eyes, because you are worthy of esteem and I love you." (Is 43,1-4). These words of God have now become a foundation in my life, on which to build and let everything be built. Nothing and no one will be able to delete them, because they totally define my person.

My family belongs to the Communion and Liberation movement and I have received an education in Christianity from an early age. At the end of high school, however, my life was very fragmented: family, school, conservatory, girlfriend, sports, etc. Instead, I felt in my heart the desire to be 'one'.

At university, I chose Architecture because I wanted to become like Antoni Gaudí and build a great work for God. I also wanted to be, as he called himself, "an architect of God." So I moved from Cuneo to Turin, to the apartments of the university students of CL. Life with them was incredible. It was a place where this desire for unity in my life was really taken seriously and where I experienced that it is possible to have real friends.

It was at the beginning of my second year that I met the Fraternity of St. Charles. Three seminarians came to the Polytechnic to present an exhibition on authorship

in literature asking us for a hand in the organization and I offered myself as a guide. We were all impressed by them, their decision to become priests and their friendship. What struck me the most was the joy that was in their eyes. It was clear that they were happy guys.

Those eyes remained imprinted on me. How was it possible that three boys, a little older than me, had a life like that? I who had "everything," didn't have that joy in my heart.

I already saw myself as a brilliant architect, married and with many children, like my family. And yet, God's plans are always different and always more beautiful than our little "inventions always made without love." It was after the visit of those seminarians that the question arose: "But if God asked you to do as they do, that is, leave everything to give your life to Him, would you be available?" Not without struggle, I finally recognized the path that God had thought for me from the beginning. A path that in 2015 took me to the gates of the seminary in Rome where God showed his faithfulness: "You belong to me, you will never be alone."



You have to love the ideal in its concreteness, because Ideal, God, Christ, Destiny are all synonymous terms. Love your destiny, ask God to let vou clearly know and love your destiny, then throughout the various circumstances God will send you where He needs to send you. It is not up to you to choose your mission. Don't be afraid, He will point it out to you. We do not choose our vocation, God gives it to us, by letting us find it within a particular context. However, we must love destiny, that is, we must love the reason to live; God demands reason."

# JESUS AND THE JEWISH ROOTS OF THE EUCHARIST

### THE BREAD OF THE PRESENCE

How is it that Jesus, as a first-century Jew, could have ever uttered the words "This is my body" and "This is my blood"? And how is it that the first Christians came to believe that the Eucharist really was the body and blood of Christ?

When we look at this question through ancient Jewish eyes, we can find an answer. If Jesus and the early Jewish Christians saw the Last Supper as the institution of the new Bread of the Presence, then it follows that they did not see it as ordinary bread and wine. It was, rather, the sign and instrument of Jesus' *real* presence. Just as God had been really and truly present to His people in the Tabernacle of Moses and the Temple of Salomon, so now Jesus would be really and truly present to his disciples through the Eucharist. And just as the old Bread of the Presence had been the sign of God's "everlasting covenant," so now the Eucharist would become the perpetual sign of the new covenant, sealed in his blood. And just as the old Bread of the Presence was also the bread of the Face of God, so now the Eucharist would be the Bread of the Face of Christ. Truly, in the

Eucharist, the early Christians could say with Jesus, "Something greater than the Temple is here."

But how are we to understand such a mystery? How can Jesus truly be present under the appearance of bread and wine? How is this even possible? For one thing, as we've already seen with both the manna and the Bread of the Presence, the mystery of Jesus' presence in the Eucharist is

closely tied to the mystery of his divine identity. If Jesus was only an earthly Messiah, then one could easily call into question [...] the idea that his blood would be the perpetual sign of the "new covenant." And if Jesus was only a great prophet, one could readily object to the idea that his body would become the new bread of God's presence. None of the prophets ever said anything like this.

However, if Jesus was *more* than a prophet, if he embodied "something greater than the Temple," yes, if he was the divine Son of God, then the new bread and wine of his new covenant were not just symbols. In a word, the new Bread of the Presence was miraculous. After all, it would take just that—a miracle—for bread and wine to be transformed into the body and blood of the Messiah.
