ear Parishioner, I would love to share with you my experience of making pilgrimages. Hopefully, I will inspire you to make one soon. One thing that I am sure of is that pilgrimages are powerful when they are done well and with an intention of encountering God.

I have always been moved by the saints in history who were witnesses to the Christian faith through pilgrimages. Among these great inspirations was St. Helena, who in her late 70's, made a long pilgrimage to the Holy Land to discover "The True Cross" in 326 AD. Her pilgrimage bore many fruits for the world to this date.

Besides the inspiration of the saints, I have always been moved by the June 3rd feast of the Martyrs in Uganda. From late April through the beginning of June, pilgrims are seen on the roads. They come from all over the country and even from other countries. While many use quick transportation, thousands walk on foot to come to celebrate the feast day of the Uganda Martyrs at Namugongo. It is at this place that 13 of the 22 martyrs were burnt on the Ascension Day, June 3, 1886. About three million pilgrims gather every year to praise the Goodness of God. Think about it! Three million people gather just to praise God. That's amazing!

As a young seminarian, I did not have this faith yet. I always asked myself, "What are all these people looking for? Young and old, men and women, sick and healthy, rich and poor?" Well, it was not until later that I discovered the more profound answer. It was not about "what." It was about "who." They are looking for an encounter with someone.

I made my first pilgrimage when I came to the United States to attend St. John Vianney Seminary here in Denver. I found my second year very challenging. I made a pilgrimage to Mother Cabrini shrine and another to Mt. Olivet Cemetery. At these two pilgrimages, I encountered God, who is more present than I am to myself. After this encounter, I continued making a pilgrimage to the downtown Cathedral once every semester. Cold or hot, I was on the road to the Cathedral on foot. By His Grace, I was ordained a priest! What a gift! I believe that the graces to be open to this gift came from those pilgrimages.

After ordination, I was assigned to Our Lady of Lourdes Nakasongola Church, a challenging parish in Kasana-Luweero diocese in Uganda. I knew it was going to be tough, so I made a private pilgrimage to the Uganda Martyrs' Shrine during the COVID-19 lockdown to tell our Lord all about it. The walk was 34-mile long. I attribute all the graces I received in my first year of priesthood to this pilgrimage.

During my second year, I decided to bring God's people with me on another pilgrimage so that we may have an encounter together. I did it with the help of grace. Sixteen people signed up to come with me on a 32-mile (49.3 km) pilgrimage in honor of the Exaltation of the Cross celebrated by the Church on September 14. Among the pilgrims was a six months pregnant woman. I was inclined to stop her, but my prideful resistance couldn't shake her faith.

We started the walk on September 13 at 5 am. By 8:30 pm, we made it to the place of destination, which is a massive crucifix at my home parish. The journey was painful, via the busy highway, which was the only way to go. It was tough. Never in my life was I as moved as by that pilgrimage. Everyone helped each other make it. During that time I saw my priesthood participating in Christ's, as the good shepherd called to support and accompany the weak and the despairing to the heavenly Jerusalem. How could I leave even one behind? Our theme for the pilgrimage was "Journeying to heaven."

The theme compelled me to fight that every pilgrim makes it.



That night of our arrival was the happiest night I had seen in a long time. After a cold shower, everyone was refreshed. Some couldn't move, others in pain, but we found ourselves around a table laughing. Though some were lying on the floor as if dead, joy flooded their hearts. "We have made it to paradise," one said. Together we had a big dinner. The pain became a great joy. Even those who could not lift a bone were happy, all cracking jokes. It was indeed a figure of the triumphant Church that had passed through the furnace of fire and great suffering. That joyful dinner of 17 pilgrims made a great impact on my priesthood. It always stands out as a picture of heaven to which I am called to lead souls through the sufferings of this life, even the weakest. The next day, we had a talk on the history and the power of the cross, then a solemn celebration of the stations of the cross and a solemn Mass. What a great encounter with God!

From this pilgrimage, much grace was poured out into the lives of many: the pilgrims, their family members, parishioners, and to others, which we shall only know in eternity, as St. John Vianney used to say. One of the pilgrims made this pilgrimage to present her sister, who was ill, and close to the end of her life. She had not only fallen away from faith, but her heart was also as hard as a rock. Within the year, this poor soul received the grace of openness to the faith and asked for a priest. She passed last April during Lent and reconciled with God.

Another grace was given to the six months pregnant woman. Her husband forbade her to walk 32 miles of pilgrimage, but her faith compelled her to risk it. One of her intentions was to pray for her husband who had no stable work as his education credential documents were stolen. For about ten years, he couldn't find work other than volunteering. But God always provided. On this pilgrimage, God answered her prayer. About a month later, the husband received a random phone call ordering him to come pick up his papers within three days.

#### Pilgrimages are powerful. Will you make one soon?

This year on September 5 through 9, I have about 60 people coming with me to the international Marian shrine in Kibeho of Rwanda. Three days after that, we shall walk the 32-mile pilgrimage again in honor of the Exaltation of the Cross on September 14. Please pray for us. And if you have any intentions, I am happy to bring them on these two pilgrimages.

Special thanks to our priests at Nativity and to all of you, my friends, who have always been a big part of my life, and you are now a strong pillar in my mission to bring the light of Christ to the remotest villages of the world.





## FROM ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

Mary arose and went with haste Luke 1:39

The above motto from World Youth Day 2023 in Lisbon highlights Mary's journey to help Elizabeth. Although Mary herself was pregnant, she traveled to help her older cousin who was preparing for the birth of her own child we now know as St. John the Baptist.

On August 15, we celebrate the feast of the Assumption. We honor Mary as she is taken up body and soul to heaven. Throughout her life Mary was faithful and said yes to God. She was there for both Jesus and her husband Joseph. Through Jesus' infancy, his growing to manhood, and his mission in the world culminating with his death on a cross, Mary was faithful. Just as Mary was there for her son, she continues to be there for us as a mother and an intercessor.

Sometimes it is not easy to say yes. We get tired. We falter. That is when Mary's example can be an inspiration for us. Whether it is in our interactions with family and friends, our work, or our volunteer activities, the mother of Jesus is someone we can turn to for encouragement.

This upcoming week we also honor St. Maximilian Kolbe on his feast day, August 14. Fr. Kolbe, was a Franciscan friar, who also had a deep devotion to Mary. At his monastery in Teresin, Poland, Fr. Kolbe was arrested by the Gestapo in February of 1941, for giving refuge to those of the Jewish faith. He was eventually sent to Auschwitz. After a prison escape, as a punishment and warning, 10 from the camp were targeted to be sent to an underground starvation bunker. One of the men selected, Franciszek Gajowniczek, was grieved and cried out because he had a wife and children. Fr. Kolbe volunteered to take his place. After 2 weeks, Fr. Kolbe was still alive, so they finished him off with a lethal injection on August 14, 1941. Notably, Mr. Gajowniczek survived Auschwitz, and was present at Fr. Kolbe's canonization as a saint in 1982.





After these exciting days, surely we feel like repeating the words of the Apostle Peter on the mount of the Transfiguration, "Lord, it is good for us to be here!" (*Mt* 17:4). Indeed, how good it has been to share this experience with Jesus, with one another, and to pray together with joyful hearts. Now, we can also ask an important question: What will we take back with us as we resume our daily lives?

I would like to answer this question with three verbs, drawing from the Gospel we have heard: to shine, to listen, and to be unafraid. What will we take back with us? I would respond with these three words: to shine, to listen, and to be unafraid.

The first: to shine. Jesus is transfigured. The Gospel tells us, "his face shone like the sun" (Mt 17:2). Shortly before this, he had predicted his passion and death on the cross, shattering the disciples' image of a powerful and worldly Messiah, and disappointing their expectations. Now, in order to help them embrace the loving plan that God has for each of us, Jesus takes three of the disciples, Peter, James, and John, and leads them up the mountain, where he is transfigured. Through this brilliant burst of light, Jesus prepares the disciples for the dark night of the Passion.

Dear young friends, today we too need something of this burst of light, so that it can fill us with hope as we face the many failures of each day and the darkness that assails us in life, and respond to them with the light of the resurrection of Jesus. For he is the light that never sets, the light that shines even in the dead of night. As the priest Ezra said, God has illumined our eyes (cf *Ezra* 9:8). Our God illumines: he illumines our vision, our hearts, our minds, our desire to do something with our lives. The Lord's light always shines.

Yet, I would like to tell you that we do not radiate light by putting ourselves in the spotlight, for that type of light is blinding. No, we cannot illumine others by projecting a perfect, well-ordered, refined image of ourselves, or by appearing to be powerful and successful, strong but without light. No, we radiate light – we shine – by welcoming Jesus into our hearts and learning to love as he does. To love like Jesus: that is what makes us shine, makes us do works of love. Friends, I am telling you the truth: whenever you do works of love, you become light. But the moment you stop loving others and become self-centered, you extinguish your light.

The second verb is to listen. On the mountain, a bright cloud overshadows the disciples. And what does it tell us, this cloud from which the Father speaks? "This is my Son, the Beloved... listen to him!" (Mt 17:5). Listen to him. To listen to Jesus, that is life's secret. Listen to what Jesus is saying to you. "But I don't know what he is saying to me." Well, take the Gospels and read there what Jesus is saying, what he is saying to your heart. For he has the words of eternal life for us, he reveals that God is our Father, that God is love. He shows us the way of love. Listen to Jesus; otherwise, even if we set out with good intentions along paths that seem to be of love, in the end those paths will be seen as selfishness disguised as love. Be careful of selfishness disguised as love! Listen to Jesus, for he will show you which paths are those of love. Listen to him. [...]

Finally the third word: **to be unafraid**. Do not be afraid. We often find these words in the Bible, in the Gospels: "Do not be afraid". These were the last words spoken by Jesus to the disciples at the moment of the Transfiguration: "Do not be afraid!" (Mt 17:7).

As young people, you have experienced these days of joy - I was about to say of glory, and indeed our encounters have been a kind of glory. You have great dreams, but often fear that they may not come true; sometimes you think that you are not up to the challenge, which is a kind of pessimism that can overcome us at times. As young people, you may be tempted at this time to lose heart, to think you fall short, or to disguise your pain with a smile. As young people, you want to change the world - and it is very good that you want to change the world - you want to work for justice and peace. You devote all your life's energy and creativity to this, but it still seems insufficient. Yet, the Church and the world need you, the young, as much as the earth needs rain. To all of you, dear young people, who are the present and the future, yes to all of you, Jesus now says: "Have no fear," "Do not be afraid!" [...]

I will tell you something else, also very beautiful: it is no longer I, but Jesus himself who is now looking at you. He knows each of your hearts, each of your lives; he knows your joys, your sorrows, your successes and failures. He knows your heart. Today, he says to you, here in Lisbon, at this World Youth Day: "Have no fear, take heart, do not be afraid!"


