

HOMILY OF CARDINAL MARCELLO SEMERARO DURING BEATIFICATION MASS (EXCERPTS)

A moment ago we heard Jesus' words at the end of the parable of the Good Samaritan: "Go, and do likewise" (Luke 10:37). It is known that Józef and Wiktoria Ulma devoted special attention to this fragment of the Gospel of St. Luke, underlining the title in red on the family Bible and adding, "Yes" next to it.

As Saint John Paul II wrote, the parable of the man who was attacked by robbers, tells the story of suffering capable of "unleashing love in man, that selfless gift of one's own "I" to other people" [John Paul II, "Salvifici doloris", 29]. This love is the heart of our celebration today. It would be a mistake if the day of the beatification of the Ulma family served only to bring to mind the terror and atrocities committed by their torturers, who are now judged by history. However,

we want today to be a day of joy, because the words of the Gospel written on paper have become for us a lived reality that shines in the Christian testimony of the Ulma couple and in the martyrdom of the new Blessed.

In 1942, Józef and Wiktoria Ulma opened the doors of their home and welcomed eight Jews persecuted by the German Nazi regime. Today, together with the new Blesseds, we also want to recall their names. They were:

THE STORY AND BEATIFICATION OF THE ULMA FAMILY

The nine members of the Ulma family were beatified on Sunday in their Polish hometown of Markowa, where they were martyred by Nazi soldiers for harbouring Jews during World War II. Pope Francis upheld the family's actions as model of Christian life for everyone to follow, as he spoke at the Angelus prayer on Sunday. He called the Ulmas "a model to imitate in our efforts to do good and serve those who are in need." "In response to the hatred and violence that characterized those times, they embraced evangelical love," he said. The Pope added that the Polish family "represented a ray of light in the darkness of the Second World War." [...] Pope Francis went on to urge Christians to follow their example by "opposing strength of arms with charity, and violent rhetoric with tenacious prayer." "May we [pray] especially for the many countries that suffer due to

war," he said. "In a special way, let us intensify our prayers for martyred Ukraine... which is suffering greatly."

BEATIFICATION MASS

Cardinal Marcello Semeraro, Prefect of the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints, presided over the beatification Mass in Markowa [...]. The beatified family members are Józef and Wiktoria Ulma, and their children Stanisława, Barbara, Władysław, Franciszek, Antoni, Maria, and an unnamed child who was born at the moment of Wiktoria's martyrdom. In his homily at the Mass, Cardinal Semeraro said the Ulma's family home became "an inn where the despised, outcast, and deathstricken was welcomed and cared for." He said Jozef and Wiktoria lived "a holiness that was not only marital but was fully embedded in their entire family."

BLESSED UNNAMED-BABE

Cardinal Semeraro also upheld the Christian witness of the newly-beatified unnamed child. "Without ever having uttered a word," he said, "today the little Blessed cries out to the modern world to welcome, love, and protect life, especially that of the defenseless and marginalized, from the moment of conception until natural death." He said the child's "innocent voice seeks to shake the consciences of a society where abortion, euthanasia, and contempt for life seen as a burden and not a gift are rampant." "The Ulma family," said the Cardinal, "encourages us to react to that throwaway culture, which Pope Francis denounces."

This gesture of Józef and Wiktoria was an expression of obedience to God's commandment. It was a "yes" to God's will. Their house became the inn where a despised, rejected and mortally wounded man was welcomed and cared for. Thanks to this, he was able to continue living. In fact, without caring, man fails:

care is a very important part of humanity, because it makes existence human.

For this gesture of hospitality and care - in a word: mercy flowing from sincere faith, the Ulma couple and their children paid the highest price of martyrdom: their lives were a precious coin with which they sealed the selflessness of the total gift of themselves in the name of love.

To fully understand the heroic decision of Józef and Wiktoria, it is necessary to look at the spiritual journey they have traveled to this point. Starting with their characters: Józef is honest, hard-working and willing to help people; Wiktoria is warm-hearted, gentle, sensitive to the needs of others. And then their constant growth in love of God and neighbor, between the activities of the parish and rural life in Markowa. We too cannot help but feel the captivating power of their Christian witness, which they passed on to their children: eight-year-old Stanisław, seven-year-old Barbara, six-year-old Władysław, four-year-old Franciszek, three-year-old Antoni and two-year-old Maria, and even the youngest child, who was born at the moment of the mother's martyrdom.

The special meaning of today's beatification also lies in the fact that the entire family is raised to the glory of the altars, united not only by blood ties, but also by the common witness given to Christ, even to the point of sacrificing their own lives.

[...] The New Blessed teach us, above all, how to accept the Word of God and strive every day to do God's will. As a family, the Ulmas listened to this Word of God in the Sunday liturgy and then continued to meditate on it at home, which can be seen in the Bible they read and emphasized. As I have already mentioned, the word "yes" written by hand in the parable of the Good Samaritan is very significant, as is the emphasis on the sentence in which Jesus calls us to love even our own enemies (Mt 5:46). [...]

The sanctifying grace of Baptism, the Eucharist and other sacraments worked perfectly in them, among which the beauty and greatness of the sacrament of *Marriage* clearly appears. *Therefore, they lived in holiness not only in marriage, but also in family life.* [...]



The Ulma house has become a place of "holiness next door," as Pope Francis calls it in his apostolic exhortation *Gaudete et exsultate* on the call to holiness in the modern world, when he writes: "I like to see holiness in the patient people of God: in parents who help with great love to grow up in their children, in men and women who work to earn their bread.... In this perseverance to move forward, day by day, I see the holiness of the Church Militant. It is often the "holiness next door," the holiness of people who live close to us and are a reflection of God's presence, or, to use another expression, the "middle class of holiness" [Francis, "*Gaudete et exsultate*," 7].

In the testimony and martyrdom of the Ulmas and their children, we rediscover the greatness of the family, a place of life, love and fertility. We rediscover the greatness of the mission that the Creator entrusted to the spouses [...].

Dear brothers and sisters, "Martyr," wrote St. John Paul II, is the most authentic witness of the truth about life. He knows that thanks to his encounter with Jesus Christ he has found the truth about his own life, and no one or nothing can take this certainty away from him. Neither suffering nor death by violence will make him abandon the truth he discovered when he encountered Christ. This is why to this day the testimony of the martyrs continues to fascinate, finds recognition, attracts attention and stimulates emulation" [John Paul II, "Fides et ratio," 32]. [...] May the testimony of the martyrdom of the Ulma family arouse in each of us here today a sincere desire to courageously live and profess the faith. [...] Blessed Józef and Wiktoria, together with your daughters and sons: Stanisława, Barbara, Władysław, Franciszek, Antoni, Maria and the youngest born at the moment of his mother's martyrdom, pray for all of us!




NATIVITY STEWARDSHIP SPOTLIGHT ALL COMES FROM HIM
