ADORATION

ednesday morning, August 16. The members of the parish staff, with some of the priests and the sisters, are spending an hour of adoration in the Church on the Rock at Camp St. Malo. There is great peace and beauty. The occasional tourists, who step into the church with the usual distraction, as if in a museum, hold their voices and stand in awe and silence in front of the unexpected presence. An entire community adores the Lord present amongst us in the Blessed Sacrament. Even the tourists are attracted by the power of His presence and the tension of each body and soul of those who are intently connected to Him in adoration.

It was the most intense moment of a three-day retreat with the intention to show how all our differences and talents are part of the one mission of Christ.

Tuesday night, Fr. Emanuele showed us an episode of *The Chosen*, the popular TV series on the life of Jesus. The *Thunder* episode describes the tensions in the early community of the disciples. Each one wanted to be the first and be recognized for their talents. Instead, Jesus shows them that there is primacy only in loving Him and in loving the others, even when they despise or ignore you. On Wednesday, Fr. Emanuele expanded on the topic, showing through the History of Salvation how God made us from the beginning for communion. This communion is the greatest gift of the Father through the loving sacrifice of the Son; it is the Church, the gift of the Holy Spirit; it is our unique existence in the unity of the whole Body of Christ, which means the family, the parish, the universal Church.

At the center of this communion is the Eucharist. The sacrament that makes us one as the Father is one with the Son and the Holy Spirit. For this reason, after the meditation, we spent an hour of silent adoration at Camp St. Malo.

The Church of Saint Catherine, or Church on the Rock, has such a beauty that many tourists who drive by stop to see it. While we were in adoration, a woman stepped in, surprised and confused. Cathy Schaffer, who saw her reaction, discreetly approached her and asked about it. The lady revealed that she was not a religious person and didn't know much about

Christianity, but driving by she felt an urge to stop and go into the church. There, she saw the people praying in front of the Blessed Sacrament, and she was confused and happy at the same time. Cathy briefly explained what was happening and invited her to stay for Mass, which followed shortly after. At the moment of the distribution of Holy Communion, the lady didn't know what to do, and Cathy gently invited her to cross her arms and come forward to receive a blessing. From the altar, I could see her coming with an expression of great joy and reverence, like a child who simply feels that what is happening is right for her, even if she couldn't say why. After Mass, Cathy said hi and invited her to visit us and to keep her heart open to the Lord.

At the end of the retreat, during a moment of sharing, Cathy told us about the lady and her story. The Lord just called her to stop and meet us in adoration. That showed me how He wants us to be true missionaries. Not just with talks and events that are an important part of the life of a parish, but first and foremost, showing that we, as a community, pray. At the heart of our words and actions, there is a Presence, a hidden love that wants to be revealed and shown to the world. This is why we treasure our Eucharistic Adoration on Thursday evenings, our Masses, and all the public prayers that we hold in the church, as well as in our families or in small communities. It is not an act of triumphalism or a show. It is instead the gift of the same nature as the Eucharist, the gift of Christ's love to us, that requires letting it shine unto the world and bring healing and peace.

Our mission is an initiative of God himself, who never ceases to send to us those who thirst for Him. They want to meet Him. We just need to be found with Him, to make this encounter happen.






DENVER CATHOLIC CATECHETICAL SCHOOL CLASS AT NATIVITY

The Catechetical School is a two-year systematic presentation of the Catholic Faith, contained both in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 80-82). This occurs in a setting that takes advantage of all the facets of effective adult learning: engaging lectures, small group dynamics, independent study, and personal application. The course proposes an encounter with Jesus Christ through the knowledge of the faith in the Apostles' Creed, to the making present of God's saving acts in the liturgy and the sacraments, to our response with the intimate conversation with God in prayer. Upon completion of this comprehensive two-year program, the student is awarded a "Certificate in Catechetical Studies."


HEALING FROM DIVORCE

The Gala is our largest fundraising event. The funds are used for important school improvement projects. Last year's Gala funds were used for important updates, including: building security upgrades, giving teachers raises, and adding additional classes. There is a gap between tuition costs and actual expenses, so our fundraising is essential to our operations. Funds for the Gala are largely raised by the live and silent auction. A committee of parent volunteers gather the auction items and put on the entire event. We rely on generous donors to give us items and services to auction off. This is also a great way for small businesses to get exposure. We need help getting items for the auction!




