The discovery of the reality of Christ, the search for fullness, the communion that feeds life, the yes to the call: the story of Fr. Luca De Chiara, ordained in 2023

saw all my hesitations and my fears come to an end, and I recognized the Fraternity as the place prepared for me by God to fulfill my life. "Son, but what kind of man do you want to be? Just a man of culture, or a man who knows what it means to be a man?" It was the last months of the eighth grade when the rector, who had recently taken over my school, addressed this question to me with which he invited me to consider enrolling in the scientific high school that was being inaugurated in the Catholic institution I was attending. That question, thrown out as a sort of challenge and basically incomprehensible for a thirteenyear-old boy, has been indelibly etched in my memory, and I recognize it today as one of the fundamental turning points of my life.

Indeed, without that provocation, the following year I would not have found myself in the class where, thanks to so many classmates and that same rector who also became my Italian professor, I met Gioventù Studentesca [High School Youth] and the movement of Communion and Liberation. The true friendship with those classmates, which continues to this day with so many of them, and the passion with which the Italian professor showed us the relevance of everything to the meaning of our lives—"from the

particular to the Whole," as he loved to repeat—gave new depth to that faith to which my family, with great love, had introduced me. In those years of high school came for me the ultimate discovery of the ideal of Christ as a real, and therefore, valid ideal for my life.

It was, however, during the years of university, while I was studying Architecture in Turin, in my city, that, thanks to the friendship with a priest of the Movement, the concrete hypothesis of giving my life to God found its way into me. It was a Sunday afternoon, returning from the Benedictine monastery of the Cascinazza, together with this priest friend, and while I was driving, this question came to me, "And if You, Lord, were asking me to give You all of my life?" It was destabilizing to recognize this question take shape in me, in the passage from the profundity of my heart to my mind, in a clear way.

I saw all my hesitations and my fears come to an end, and I recognized the Fraternity as the place prepared for me by God to fulfill my life.

There, followed a period of discernment to discover the origin and meaning of that question that was manifesting itself as persistent and inescapable. While on the one hand, I sensed that my life could be fulfilled in the priesthood looking at so many luminous witnesses I had encountered up to that point on the other hand, a concern grew within me that I was facing a life in solitude, as I observed in many cases, and which I felt was untenable. Faced with this anxiety, the priest with whom I was speaking advised me to suspend the path of discernment and concentrate on completing college, "Surely, if the Lord wants to make you more his own, he will make you understand."

After finishing my studies, I began to work as a professor in the same school that I had frequented as a young man and to collaborate with a few design studios of my city. Despite the fact that my work was interesting and I lived with enthusiasm and passion, and that [...] many interests filled my life, something unresolved persisted like a constant undertone in my heart and it made me live everything as limited and unsatisfying. I continued to feel the urgency to take up a radical path for my life.

In 2014, the Fraternity of St. Charles inaugurated its new mission in Turin at the Parish of Santa Giulia, and a young deacon was sent to teach religion at the high school where I worked. We became fast friends with this young man, roughly my age, and it was he, taking my questions about the Fraternity seriously, who invited me to dinner and introduced me to his brothers.

How beautiful it is to begin to recognize, looking back, the development of the magnificent design that God is knitting with our lives.

Spending time in the home of the missionaries of St. Charles, I was immediately struck by the dimension of fraternal communion that I saw feeding their lives. Finally, in the welcoming warmth of that house, after so much waiting, I saw all my hesitations and my fears come to an end, and I recognized the Fraternity as the place prepared for me by God to fulfill my life. Two years later, in September 2016, I would begin my journey of formation in the seminary

on Via Boccea together with the brothers who are with me in priestly ordination and have become among the dearest companions of my life.

How beautiful is to begin to recognize, looking back, the development of the magnificent design that God is knitting with our lives, beginning with a small

or Christmas, we had a beautiful Nativity Play for the children enrolled in the Religious Education program at Nativity. In a conversation with Miss Diane, Miss Beverly, Sister Mariagrazia, and the catechists, we realized that probably, in the public school that most of our kids attend, no one would have told them about the birth of Jesus. Therefore, during Advent, we worked with the children to make the sheep, the angel wings, and costumes for the play. Above all, we prepared the songs to sing after every scene, from the Annunciation to the flight to Egypt. Some of the children didn't even know about the existence of the Magi! Thanks to the catechists, everyone had a small part in the play: the kids from first to third grade were angels, sheep, and shepherds. The fourth and fifth graders were kings and holy family members and often had to say a few words or act like one of the main characters: Mary, Joseph, or the Angel Gabriel. Miss Joann and Miss Lisa prepared the script, following the gospel of Matthew and Luke and connecting the different scenes with great ability.

Beginning from the Annunciation, we went through the central moments of Jesus' infancy: the Birth in Bethlehem, the glory of the Angels and the Shepherds singing together, the visit of the three kings, and the flight to Egypt. After every scene, the children turned to their parents and relatives, inviting them to sing one of the traditional Christmas songs together. From *Away in a Manger* to *Joy to the World* and *Go, Tell It on the Mountain*, the sixty kids and their almost two hundred family members joined their voices in a beautiful choir to celebrate the Birth of Our Lord.

The event of Christmas, the birth of Jesus among shepherds, kings, and angels, is so close to the hearts of children that nothing needs to be explained: it is enough to live it together. The children helped the adults to look once again, with simple eyes, at the mystery of the Son of God, who makes himself flesh.

#### **REGISTRATION IS OPEN**

The Restored Order is when a baptized child—after making his or her First Reconciliation—is confirmed and also receives First Communion at the Confirmation Mass.

#### **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Candidates seeking the Restored Order must be a baptized Catholic who is 7 years or older.
   She or he must have two years of Faith Formation (first grade or up) within two years of receiving the sacraments.
- Candidates solely seeking Confirmation need to have one year of Faith Formation (first grade or up) within two years of receiving the sacraments.
- Faith Formation includes Religious Education classes, Nativity (or other) Catholic schooling, homeschool Religious Education, and Venturers of the Star Middle School group.





# MESSAGE OF JOHN PAUL II TO THE NATIONAL CATHOLIC EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF THE UNITED STATES

Vatican, 1979

IT IS A JOY for me to address the members of the National Catholic Educational Association of the United States, as you assemble in the great cause of Catholic Education. [...]

Among the many reflections that could be made at this time there are three points in particular to which I would like to make a brief reference at the beginning of my pontificate. These are: the value of Catholic schools, the importance of Catholic teachers and educators, and the nature of Catholic education itself.

[...] With profound conviction I ratify and reaffirm the words that Paul VI spoke originally to the Bishops of your country: "Brethren, we know the difficulties involved in preserving Catholic schools, and the uncertainties of the future, and yet we rely on the help of God and on your own zealous collaboration and untiring efforts, so that Catholic schools can continue, despite grave obstacles, to fulfill their providential role at the service of genuine Catholic education, and at the service of your country". Yes, the Catholic school must remain a privileged means of Catholic education in America. As an instrument of the apostolate it is worthy of the greatest sacrifices. In order that the Catholic school and the Catholic teachers may truly make their irreplaceable contribution to the Church and to the world, the goal of Catholic education itself must be crystal clear. Beloved sons and daughters of the Catholic Church, brothers and sisters in the faith: Catholic education is above all a question of communicating Christ, of helping to form Christ in the lives of others. [...]

Nativity is under the pastoral care of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo, a religious order, founded in 1985 by Msgr. Massimo Camisasca in Italy. The order has its origins in the charism of Fr. Luigi Giussani, founder of the Catholic lay movement Communion and Liberation (CL). Here is how the Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo is described by the founder, Msgr. Massimo Camisasca:

Fraternity: "The Fraternity is a companionship made up of people that are placed together by an Other. [...] Each of us [...] is continually accompanied by Christ through his brothers."

Priestly: "The priestly vocation [...] is a continuous communion with God and man. [...] It acts as a bridge between heaven and earth, represents a fundamental link in the history of salvation, and also serves as an important figure in the journey towards unity among men."

Missionary: "Mission [...] consists simply in entering within the same mission for which God sent His own Son into the world, for which the Son sent the Apostles, and for which, in turn, the Apostles sent other brothers, until the visible echo of that event touched even us."

The priests of the Fraternity live together in houses of three or more. The communion among them is meant to sustain their vocation and be a path towards conversion. They are willing to be sent around the world wherever the Church has a need, according to the wishes of the bishop of the diocese in which they reside. Learn more at:


