his week, I would like to talk to you about Eucharistic Adoration. In this year, in which we implement the National Eucharistic Revival at a parish level, I desire that our parish may grow in awareness about the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and desire to adore Him and receive Him mindfully and properly. During this year, we will propose several events that will help us grow in that awareness. Among the proposed gestures will be Eucharistic Adoration and the Holy Hour.

Besides the words of Christ in the Gospel of St. John, God has granted several miracles throughout the history of the Church so that we can become more aware and sensitive to the sacrament of the Eucharist. One of those miracles initiated the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which we celebrate in June. The miracle happened in response to an Italian priest's tragic doubts about the Real Presence, the reality of the "transubstantiation." As we know, this term stands for the miraculous event for which, during the consecration, the bread's and wine's substances are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, while their external and visible appearances remain the ones of the bread and wine.

In 1263, in Bolsena, Italy, the priest witnessed a great miracle. The Body of Christ bled in his hands while he was celebrating Mass. He brought the evidence to the pope, who resided in the nearby city of Orvieto. The pope, after administering the sacrament of confession to the repenting priest, initiated the canonical process to certify

the miracle, and later on, he instituted the Solemnity of Corpus Christi for the universal Church.

The corporal with the spots of the Sacred Blood of Christ is now being preserved in the Cathedral of Orvieto, Italy, to remind the whole Church every year of this true "mystery of faith." The pope commended St. Thomas Aquinas for writing the words of the liturgy of the Solemn Mass of Corpus Christi. The saint helped educate our awareness of the Real Presence in Adoration, which reached its highest peak in the *Hymn Adoro Te Devote* (I Devoutly Adore You). It is a Latin Gregorian hymn composed by St. Thomas that I learned in the seminary. Its words help me immerse in the contemplation of the Eucharist.

In the seminary and our Fraternity of Saint Charles Borromeo houses, we became accustomed to starting our daily hour of "silence" and meditation with the Eucharistic Adoration together. Being faithful to that moment, even when I felt tired or not particularly awake, adoration brought a lot of fruits to my relationship with Christ. When I raise the consecrated Host during Mass, it is a short and yet real moment of adoration.


I offer now an exhortation of Pope Benedict XVI, who reminded us often that the Eucharist is the center and source of renewal of the Church. "Go to the encounter with Him in the Blessed Eucharist, go to adore Him in the churches, kneeling before the Tabernacle: Jesus will fill you with His love and will reveal to you the thoughts of His Heart. If you listen to Him, you will feel ever more deeply the joy of belonging to His

Mystical Body, the Church, which is the family of his disciples held close by the bond of unity and love." (Benedict XVI, Netherlands, 2005)

How true this is! At the Parish Staff retreat, we experienced together Eucharistic Adoration, and we felt true living communion. With these thoughts, I invite you to make time and space in your lives, personally and with your families and friends, to live the fulfilling experience of the Holy Hour during the Forty Hours Devotion.

How I wish that our Adoration Chapel became a place of perpetual adoration, where adorers experience not only self-renewal but offer themselves and their weekly hour—even through the sacrifice of being there in the middle of the night—for the spiritual support of our parish and the entire Church. Could you consider it?

The Restored Order is when a baptized child—after making his or her First Reconciliation—is confirmed and also receives First Communion at the Confirmation Mass.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Candidates seeking the Restored Order must be a baptized Catholic who is 7 years or older.
 She or he must have two years of Faith Formation (first grade or up) within two years of receiving the sacraments.
- Candidates solely seeking Confirmation need to have one year of Faith Formation (first grade or up) within two years of receiving the sacraments.
- Faith Formation includes Religious Education classes, Nativity (or other) Catholic schooling, homeschool Religious Education, and Venturers of the Star Middle School group.

I met Deacon David in 2017 when I arrived here as a transitional deacon. He was ordained the same year as a permanent deacon. We used to converse after Mass about conversion stories and Marian apparitions. But it was mainly during the last months when I was appointed pastor that we sat down and talked. He had just returned from a pilgrimage to Wisconsin to our Lady of Champion shrine. I had just returned from a pilgrimage to Lourdes. We shared a lot about the peace found in places where Mary appeared and the fullness of having visited them. Then, I had the honor to accompany him more closely

during the journey of his illness. [...]

His state of physical need in which he lived for the past months gave all of us the honor of serving him and being nourished by his humility, his meekness, his faith, and his love. As he gradually kept losing strength, he never missed the opportunity to raise his hand and express his thanksgiving. Or to whisper the Hail Mary, or to make the sign of the cross.

[...] I am grateful for the work of sanctification he has brought to our Parish through his ministry, through his faith in God the Father and Jesus Christ our Savior, and his filial devotion to our Blessed Mother, which united many of us with him, and one of my favorite saints, Francis.

As we entrust him to the Mercy of God, may he find eternal rest, and now see face to face the one for whom he worked, tirelessly and zealously, Jesus Christ.

The 2024 theme is, "You shall love the Lord your God ... and your neighbor as yourself" which is taken from the gospel of Luke 10:27. Our brothers and sisters in our local Christian churches in Broomfield also share the gospel mandate to see Jesus in our neighbors in need. In the 2024 prayer for Christian Unity, which is found on the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) website, it recognizes... "that all human beings are our neighbors" and asks the Lord for " ... a new Spirit of love and solidarity, that we may proclaim your good news to all of creation." This prayer is humbly joined with our fellow Christians through our belief in God's son Iesus Christ.



"YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD ... AND YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF"

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity was celebrated by Catholics and other Christians worldwide from January 18 to 25. The theme for 2024, "You shall love the Lord your God ... and your neighbor as yourself," was taken from the Gospel of Luke and selected by the Vatican's Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity, the Faith and Order Commission of the World Council of Churches, and the ecumenical community of Chemin Neuf in Burkina Faso. The internationally observed effort first started in 1908 under the leadership of Servant of God Father Paul Wattson, the founder of an Anglican religious community and later a convert to Catholicism. It was initially called the Octave of Christian Unity, with the approval of Pope Pius X, and promoted by Pope Benedict XV. This year's celebration marked the 60th anniversary of the historic meeting between Pope Paul VI and Orthodox Ecumenical Patriarch Athenagoras I of Constantinople on the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem in 1964. That was the first formal meeting of a pope and ecumenical patriarch since 1438, marking a paradigm shift in the ecumenical relations between the Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches. On January 16, a group of Nativity parishioners participated in the Prayer Service for Christian Unity at Cross of Christ Lutheran Church in Broomfield. Father John Roderick and the Nativity choir joined other choirs, congregations, and pastors from Broomfield churches to ask for the grace of unity. We keep praying that all Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (*John* 17:21)

Nativity is under the pastoral care of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo, a religious order, founded in 1985 by Msgr. Massimo Camisasca in Italy. The order has its origins in the charism of Fr. Luigi Giussani, founder of the Catholic lay movement Communion and Liberation (CL). Here is how the Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo is described by the founder, Msgr. Massimo Camisasca:

Fraternity: "The Fraternity is a companionship made up of people that are placed together by an Other. [...] Each of us [...] is continually accompanied by Christ through his brothers."

Priestly: "The priestly vocation [...] is a continuous communion with God and man. [...] It acts as a bridge between heaven and earth, represents a fundamental link in the history of salvation, and also serves as an important figure in the journey towards unity among men."

Missionary: "Mission [...] consists simply in entering within the same mission for which God sent His own Son into the world, for which the Son sent the Apostles, and for which, in turn, the Apostles sent other brothers, until the visible echo of that event touched even us."

The priests of the Fraternity live together in houses of three or more. The communion among them is meant to sustain their vocation and be a path towards conversion. They are willing to be sent around the world wherever the Church has a need, according to the wishes of the bishop of the diocese in which they reside. Learn more at:


