Dear Parishioner,

his Sunday, we conclude the Octave of Easter. The day of Easter lasts for eight days so that we can be re-created, in sevenplus-one days, by this divine event of the Resurrection of Christ.

The Sacred Triduum we celebrated together has certainly helped us to be more aware of Christ's resurrection through this octave. It was truly a divine and human event that immersed us into the mysteries of Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. As human creatures made of mind and body, we truly need to be physically drawn into the Mystery of God through the perceptive signs of the Liturgy. We cannot simply rely on our thoughts and our imagination; we cannot simply try to concentrate and be absorbed by the events of our salvation.

Through washing someone's feet, I could truly perceive anew that service is an essential dimension of my priesthood. By staying in the dark, silent church close to the Tabernacle, I was drawn into the mystery of Gethsemane. Only through fasting could I have a true glimpse of what Christ went through for us in the passion. Only entering the dark church in silence, following the only light of the Paschal Candle, and seeing the light spreading through the assembly gathered in the church, we could taste the

beginning of Creation when God said, through his Son, "Let there be light," and we could taste what happened that night in the sepulcher and in the netherworld, when Christ, true light, broke through the darkness of death, the yoke of sin. During Easter Vigil, we could feel our catechumens sharing Christ's death and resurrection as they immersed themselves in the water of the baptismal font. On the day of Easter, we felt rejuvenated again by commemorating our baptism and being sprinkled with Holy Water.

Besides these tactile and visible elements, the Liturgy immersed us in these marvelous and divine works of Salvation through sound. Deep and thick silence introduced us to the Mystery of the Presence of God. Sacred Music, sung magnificently by our Choir, helped us contemplate this Presence. The lyrics and music of Allegri's Miserere (Psalm 51) that we listened to during the kissing of the relic of the Cross led us down into the depth of the misery for our sin and then elevated our miserv into a soaring plea to God for His Mercy. The Missa de Angelis Mass parts, now part of our congregational singing, introduced us to the Mystery of each Mass.

I was told by one of you that during one of our Easter Masses, a guest exclaimed in wonder at the beauty of the Liturgy, and she pulled up secretly her phone, trying to capture what her heart was perceiving and, at the same time, trying to avoid being disruptive or disrespectful to the Liturgy. This clumsy and yet genuine act, although it revealed for sure a lack of familiarity with the practice of her faith, indicates to us once again the wonder we ourselves perceived during the Triduum.

Truly the Liturgy is the work of Christ the Priest and of His Body, which is the Church. That's why the summit of the Liturgy is the Eucharist, where in the Body and Blood of Christ, Christ coincides with the reality through which he makes Himself manifest.

HE SIMPLY CALLED HIM "ABBA," WHICH MEANS "DADDY"

MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR THE FIRST WORLD CHILDREN'S DAY **MAY 25–26, 2024**

Dear Children!

Your first World Day, which will be held in Rome on May 25-26 this year, is fast approaching. That is why I thought of sending you a Message. [...] I want to speak to each of you, dear children, because, as the Bible teaches us, and as Jesus showed so often, "you are precious" in God's eyes (*Is* 43:4). [...] All of you, girls and boys, are a source of joy for your parents and your families, but also for our human family and for the Church, in which each of us is like a link in a great chain stretching from the past to the future and covering the whole earth. [...]

That is why I encourage you to pay attention to the stories of grownups: your moms and dads, your grandparents and great grandparents. And not to forget all those other children and young people who are already battling illness and hardship, in hospital or at home, and those who even now are being cruelly robbed of their childhood. [...]

Now, I am going to share a special secret with you. If we really want to be happy, we need to pray, to pray a lot, to pray every day, because prayer connects us directly to God. Prayer fills our hearts with light and warmth; it helps us to do everything with confidence and peace of mind. Jesus constantly prayed to the Father. Do you know what Jesus called him? In his language, he simply called him **"Abba,"** which means **"Daddy"** (*Mk* 14:36). Let's do the same thing! We will always feel that Jesus is close to us. He himself promised us that, when he said, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (*Mt* 18:20). [...]

Dear children, you may know that in May, many of us will be together in Rome, to be together with children from all over the world. To prepare well for this, I would ask all of you to pray the same prayer that Jesus taught us - the *Our Father*. Recite it every morning and every evening, in your families too, together with your parents, brothers, sisters and grandparents. But not just by saying the words! [...] Jesus, who offered himself on the Cross to gather all of us together in love, who conquered death and reconciled us with the Father, wants to continue his work in the Church through us. Think about this, especially those of you who are preparing to receive First Communion. God has loved us from all eternity (*Jer* 1:5). He looks upon us with the eyes of a loving father and a gentle mother. He never forgets us (*Is* 49:15) and every day he accompanies us and renews us with his Spirit.

Nativity is under the pastoral care of the **Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo**, a religious order, founded in 1985 by Msgr. Massimo Camisasca in Italy. The order has its origins in the charism of Fr. Luigi Giussani, founder of the Catholic lay movement Communion and Liberation (CL). Here is how the Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo is described by the founder, Msgr. Massimo Camisasca:

Fraternity: "The Fraternity is a companionship made up of people that are placed together by an Other. [...] Each of us [...] is continually accompanied by Christ through his brothers."

Priestly: "The priestly vocation [...] is a continuous communion with God and man. [...] It acts as a bridge between heaven and earth, represents a fundamental link in the history of salvation, and also serves as an important figure in the journey towards unity among men."

Missionary: "Mission [...] consists simply in entering within the same mission for which God sent His own Son into the world, for which the Son sent the Apostles, and for which, in turn, the Apostles sent other brothers, until the visible echo of that event touched even us."

The priests of the Fraternity live together in houses of three or more. The communion among them is meant to sustain their vocation and be a path towards conversion. They are willing to be sent around the world wherever the Church has a need, according to the wishes of the bishop of the diocese in which they reside. Learn more at:
